<u>History</u>: Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, was founded in 1741 by Moravian settlers, including the remnants of a failed settlement in Georgia (begun 1735), and served as a home base for missionaries and traveling preachers whose duties carried them to native Americans and European settlers in New York, Pennsylvania, Connecticut, New Jersey, the Caribbean, and South America. The Lancaster Moravian congregation was formed in 1746.

Worship services structured life in Lancaster, as in all other Moravian congregations in the eighteenth century. Devotional meetings for small groups or the whole community occurred several times daily. In smaller assemblies hymns might be sung without accompaniment. Three services involved music in special ways. Sunday morning preaching services included liturgies according to the Lutheran liturgical year, usually along with one or two anthems and congregational hymns.

Some ten miles apart, Lancaster and Lititz Moravian congregations shared many resources, notably the musical gifts of Johannes Herbst (1735-1812), who served in Lancaster from 1786-1791 before being called to Lititz. Herbst traveled often to Lititz to direct the music at festival occasions, most notably the dedication of the new church building at Lititz in 1787.

<u>Scope and Content</u>: The collection consists of 41 pieces for voice and piano. The majority were published in the middle third of the 19<sup>th</sup> century, though some were written earlier. The works include selections from operas and oratorios; secular songs and ballads; and sacred songs. Several of the printed pieces bear the signature "Clara Rauch", and a name plate on the cover of the volume reads "Clara C. Rauch". A bookplate on the inside front cover reads "G. William Riegel". A bookbinder's tag attached to the title page of the first piece reads:
