JAMES V. SALZWEDEL AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE IN CHURCH MUSIC

We are each called to raise our hearts and our voices in praise and thanksgiving, and in lament, to our

Lord. Over the years, many musicians have given excellent and long -lasting service to music and worship in Moravian congregations. Recognition for these individuals affirms the vital importance of music in Moravian worship; the critical role played by accomplished musicians in leading the music programs in the congregations, in encouraging and supporting congregational song, in the development of

musical skills for all members of a congregation, and in guiding young people in their musical and spiritual growth.

Jeff Whitsett was presented his award during Salem Congregation's Easter Band Breakfast at Home Moravian Church in Winston-Salem, NC by Nola Knouse.

Jeff Whitsett has served as Director of Moravian Bands in Winston-Salem since 2006, and as Associate Director from 1992 to 2005. He directed the Salem Band from 1992 to 2011, and is now serving as Director Emeritus. As director of the Easter Band, Jeff has encouraged the members to focus on musicianship and ensemble playing, and his work has borne fruit in the rich and warm sound of the band.

Jeff has worked more than twenty-four years in the music

print industry, establishing outstanding relationships with publishers, composers, arrangers, conduc-

tors, educators and performing musicians. As an accomplished performer on the euphonium, he has performed with the Winston-Salem Symphony, Greensboro Symphony, and North Carolina Symphony, and is now serving as Principal Euphonium and Associate Conductor of the Piedmont Wind Symphony.

Jeff has always encouraged the life-long enjoyment of playing a musical instrument, and continues to witness to his faith, through the ministry of music, modeling true servanthood, with his life and musical gifts offered in witness and praise to our Lord Jesus Christ.

Nancy Marie Manuel was presented with her award at Fairview Moravian Church by Nola Knouse on May 31. Nancy Manuel has been an active participant in the music program at Fairview Moravian Church for the past 78 years, since she was 2 years old. Before she could read, she was singing in the Fairview Children's Choir, and later in the Junior Choir. She joined the Chancel Choir at age fifteen and for many years, sang the soprano solo in "Thou Child Divine." and countless other solos. Not content to limit her musical contributions to the choir. Nancy (pictured. below) played clarinet in Fairview's band for 15 years, and in Advent Moravian's band, where she received a certificate as "most improved woodwind musician."

the idea of bringing some of our 18th century manuscripts to life. Sarah has prepared editions of

three choral works, and was able to peruse archival manuscripts, in both Bethlehem and in Herrnhut, Germany, while attending Convo 2015. Sarah is a Music Therapy major at Moravian College.

The SOAR partnership began in the summer of 2009 when rising

possessed a thirst for knowledge, underscored by the fact that – along with her summer SOAR project, and attending the 2009 Moravian Music Festival – she completed an honors project transcribing two Polish nativity plays (szopki), written in the World War II concentration camps of Ravensbruck and Dachau (learning Polish in order to do so!) After graduation, Cynthia received a Fulbright scholarship to spend a year in Warsaw (Poland) doing further research into szopkis. Cynthia will pursue a doctorate in musicology. She has married and is currently residing in Villingen, Germany – a short 10 kilometers from the Moravian community of Königsfeld.

Summer 2012 brought MELISSA ZIRKEL, a double major in German Studies and Music Education clarinet). In addition to preparing three editions for her



SOAR proiect – two choral anthems and one instrumental work -Melissa took the German Script

course offered by the Northern Province Archives, thus arming herself to better translate 18th century anthem texts. Later that fall, she rearranged her edition of the instrumental Parthia for performance by the college's Clarinet Choir at the 2012 Moravian College Christmas Vespers. Melissa graduated summa cum laude from Moravian College in May 2013, after which, she took a job in Kansas City with Teach For America, choosing to devote three years of her life to teaching students in underprivileged areas.

RACHEL RUISARD, a Vocal Performance major, minoring in Medieval Studies, was our 2013 SOAR student. In addition to pre-

paring editions of three manuscripts (one of which has been published in our Moravian Star Anthem series!) Rachel attended the 2013 Moravian Music



in the Festival Chorus and participating in the conducting class of Festival Director, John Sinclair. Following the Festival, Rachel was able to participate in an intense

three-day "editing marathon" during which she and 15 Rollins College students transcribed more than twenty anthems by J. F. Peter. Rachel graduated with honors from Moravian College in May 2014, and spent the past year at Oxford University (England), obtaining a master's degree. This fall she will enter the University of Maryland, in pursuit of a Ph.D. in Musicology.

For the summer of 2014, **TIM** McGORREY, a Music Education (violin) major at Moravian, came to transcribe a string quartet in the MMF collection – a multimovement piece by Franz Xavier Richter, one of the non-Moravian composers in our collection. To enhance his knowledge of German, Tim also elected to begin his 10week project by participating in the Archives' German Script course, thus laying an excellent foundation for the work ahead of him. Tim graduated summa cum laude from Moravian, this spring, and is currently pursuing a teaching career.

In his opening remarks to the 2015 SOAR students, Moravian College President, Dr. Bryon Grigsby, stated how proud he was of the SOAR program – both of the students themselves for achieving admission to the program, as well as of the college itself for its ability to provide students with such a unique opportunity to hone their research skills.

The Moravian Music Foundation is equally proud of the students who have participated in the SOAR program, and we are extremely grateful to Moravian College and especially Dr. Hilde Binford, Chair of the Music Department, for working in conjunction with MMF – providing both entities the opportunity to nurture tomorrow's musicologists!

The modern edition was completed by David Blum and Nola Reed Knouse and the piece was given its first modern performance at the 24th Moravian Music Festival in Bethlehem in 2013. The double chorus and soloists are supported by Peter Kubath, organist, and the Bach Festival Orchestra, a 26-piece ensemble. Soloists featured on the recording are: Mary Wilson, Amanda M. Schumpert, and Julie Batman, sopranos; Glenn Siebert, and Keith Alexander Bolves, tenors; Matthew K. Begale, bass.
