

The Herrnhut congregation is celebrating its 300th with a complete renovation of the church sanctuary. The organ has been refurbished and will be re-installed for an inaugural concert on May 14, 2022. The Anniversary Celebration will last all year, but the main events will take place during the week of June 12 - 19, 2022.

The organ refurbishment and restoration strives to recreate the historic sound and acoustic of an 18th century organ. The organ will have additional stops added, in the style of American organ builder, David Tannenberg, using his historical technical plans, preserved in the United States. Tannenberg's family was from Herrnhut and he emigrated to America in 1748.



These 18th century organs were made to produce a light and lovely sound so that the congregational singing was prominent. "We are thankful that we are able to pursue this organ renovation under these special arrangements," said Pastor Peter Vogt. "To create a truly unique instrument that makes it possible once again to perform in the style of the Moravian composers of the early days of Herrnhut."

Moravian Star Anthems

Sometimes the newest and latest thing has been around for a long time.

HAVE YOU BEEN INTERESTED IN MORAVIAN ANTHEMS BUT DID NOT KNOW HOW TO VIEW THEM / PERUSE THEM?



Blue Series = 18th and 19th century Moravian anthems (most from manuscript) edited for modern performance.

Red Series = 20th and 21st century anthems by contemporary Moravian composers, like Bruckart, French, Henkelmann, Bates, Nelson and Gunn, Dixon, and Pumper.

Green Series = anthems for smaller choirs, usually SAB, in lower keys, with simplified accompaniment. Also, useful for solos and duets. A great place to start!

We are currently compiling audio files to pair with each anthem, but that will take a while longer.

What unifies all Moravian anthems is their ability to connect worshipers to Christ and to our Moravian musical heritage through the quality of music and the sincerity of the texts.

We now have our anthems as *products* in the MMF online store!

They each have detailed descriptions and images that will give you a quick look at the octavo sheet music. You will be able to see the key, get an idea of the range, the rhythms, and how involved the accompaniment part is. The descriptions include a note about other versions, history, and whether instrumental parts are available. Remember that a cool feature of the **Moravian Star Anthem Series** is the availability of accompaniment in a lower key, to make those high soprano parts more accessible.
